50 years of failed attempts to decipher the tight, faded 19th-century cursive across multiple generations of technology.

Out of the original collection, only four pages survive every generational transfer.

## The 30-Second Breakthrough

- After 50 years of dead ends, AI provided a perfect transcription of the four pages in under 30 seconds. But the transcription wasn't the breakthrough—the contextual question was.
- In 5 minutes, AI cross-referenced records to reveal Robert was Robert Walker Hume Sr.—Edward's brother-in-law. Edward was writing his wife Janet to check if her brother had survived the battle.

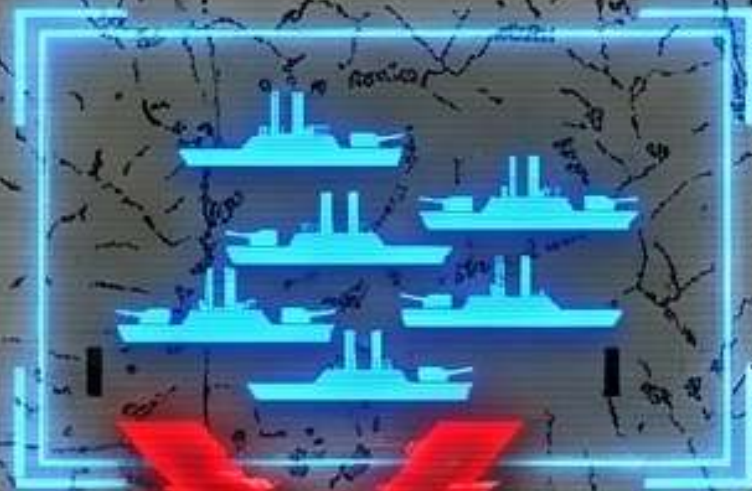
Grieving lost comrades

**The Stakes:** The Union army cannot retreat without the fleet. If they cannot pass the rapids, ten gunboats must be destroyed to prevent capture.



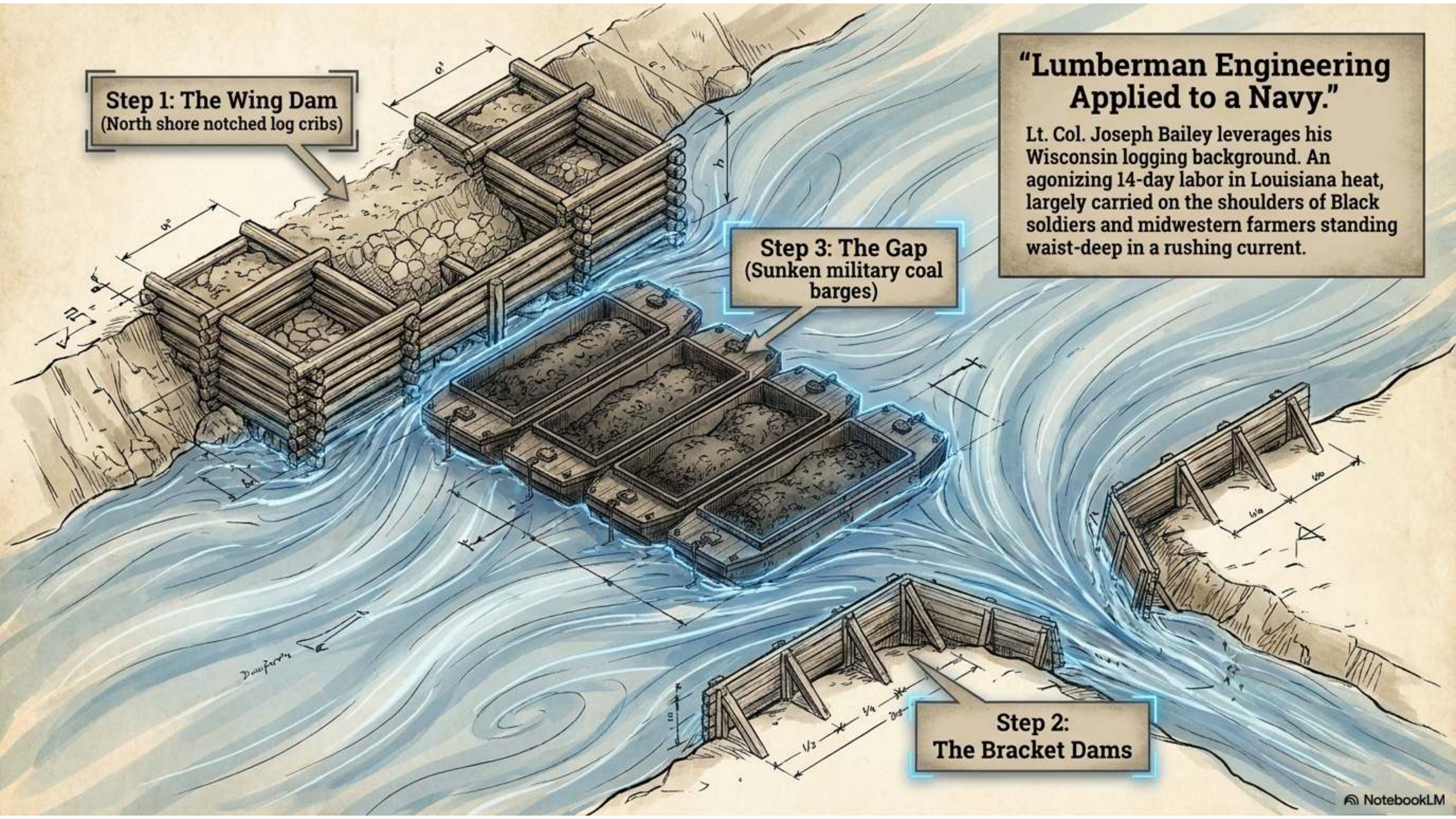
# "Lumberman Engineering Applied to a Navy."

Physical Toll


Alexandria:

While Edward measures time by marches and gunfire, Janet measures time by silence and waiting. She manages an agricultural household and five young children in Wisconsin, desperate for news of both her husband and her brother Robert. A letter is proof that the world before the army still exists.
